

## JEREMIAH PART VI MAY 14-15, 2022

### INTRODUCTION

- Last week we talked about seeing with spiritual eyes ...where we get our hope and promise.
- This week we'll talk about the prophecies of Jesus in Jeremiah.
- Jesus quoted Jeremiah in the New Testament when He was driving the money changers out of the temple.
- In Isaiah, Ezekiel and Jeremiah are prophecies that are forthtelling - clarifying the present situation.
- Mixed in with them are prophecies that are foretelling of a future messiah.

### I. A NEW DAY IS ON THE WAY

- Throughout the book of Jeremiah God offers hope in the midst of discipline.
- He makes promises to His people.
- But sometimes the promises clearly go beyond that moment and just those people - Jeremiah 3:14-17.
- The people must have been shocked when Jeremiah says the day would come when the ark of the covenant would be gone, forgotten, and never missed (vs. 16).
- Like Jesus, Jeremiah saw beyond external faith and taught that God was seeking the heart.

### II. A SHOCKING REVELATION

- Jeremiah 31:31-32, "The days are coming," declares the Lord, "when I will make a new covenant..."
- Jeremiah 31:33-34, "...the covenant I will make with the people of Israel...", declares the Lord. "I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts. I will be

their God, and they will be my people...they will all know Me...", declares the Lord. "For I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more."

- Hebrews 8:7, "For if there had been nothing wrong with that first covenant, no place would have been sought for another..."
- The problem was always a problem of the heart.
- The relationship is personal now, not national.
- That is what Jesus' blood does; wipes our sin away, makes us clean and heals our hearts - Matthew 26:28
- Jeremiah 31:35-37 - Israel won't be forgotten
- It would be easier for the sun to stop shining...than for God to break His promises to His people Israel.
- Zechariah 12:10-13:1, "...<sup>13</sup>...a fountain will be opened to the house of David and the inhabitants of Jerusalem, to cleanse them from sin and impurity."

### III. FINALLY WE FIND THE SAVIOR IS COMING

- Last year I taught on the branch...
- It has to do with the lineage or line of David that was prophesied to be bringing the Messiah.
- Only his lineage had fallen on hard times.
- Only a branch would be left, but it would be enough for the Messiah.
- Jeremiah 33:15-16, In those days...I will make a righteous Branch of David sprout; and He shall execute justice and righteousness on the earth...and this is the name by which it will be called: the Lord is our righteousness."
- There is only one called the "Righteous One" or the righteousness of God...Jesus.
- 2 Corinthians 5:20-21, "...<sup>21</sup> God made Him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God."
